

Workshop : Moral development

Following the series of workshops by the Young Verified leaders' participants of We Love Sousse. On September 24, 2022, Farah Guicha and Khouloud Ben Mohamed delivered a workshop on the moral development of the human personality at the association headquarter with the presence of the members.

It started with presenting a real-life scenario (parents yelling at a student at a school, you were present, how would you respond? What would you do coping with what you saw?).

Participants had the opportunity to first state their reactions then Khouloud and Farah showed them six photos and reactions related to the scenario. For example there was the character of a student that choose to be distant and never go for a reaction fearing the punishment , or a director who tried to solve the issue inviting parents for discussion etc... They attempted to examine and interpret them from their own points of view.




Moving the following part of the workshop, where participants worked in groups to reorder these reactions based on how they thought, they discussed together to decide what is the right order.

Farah and Khoulood explained the steps belonging to every phase with each example matching the pictures and the work of each group. Providing the definition that: **moral development is a theory by Kohlberg that focuses on how children develop morality and moral reasoning from childhood to adolescence and adulthood, passing through six essential stages.**

The stages illustrated as follows:

Discussion held after what was presented, where participants shared their personal opinions and experiences, they tried to compare and reflect on how they develop these reactions through their age. It was fruitful that everyone participated. There was a diversity in terms of ideas.

The session ended with a feedback section through small letters and notes written by the attendees mentioning the interest of the topic as the enjoyable atmosphere as well the information provided in a clear way.
